Chapter 1 : Herbarium

Conserve o gram november 2009 number 11/12 introduction a herbarium consists of preserved plant speci-mens, each with a label bearing documentary information. herbaria are repositories for vascular plants, bryophytes, lichens, algae, and fungi. specimens are used as references for comparison and identification with unknownA herbarium is a collection of dried plants systematically named and arranged for ready reference and study. to make a herbarium specimen, the plant is collected, and notes are made about it. the plant is then pressed until dry between blotters that absorb moisture and mounted onto a herbarium sheet with a suitable label.Herbarium where it will be further processed and properly stored. now available online, index herbariorum (holmgren and holmgren 1998; holmgren et al. 1990) is a catalog of the world's officially recognized herbarium collections and a useful source with addresses and contact information for herbaria.Projects must be herbarium-based, either using or vouchering herbarium specimens or analyzing herbarium specimen data. this includes but not limited to, taxonomic revisions using herbarium specimens, phylogenetic analyses using data from herbarium specimens, ecological studies that will result in vouchers deposited in the tennCategories of collections the herbarium collection is composed of preserved plant parts or samples that are used to support the taxonomic research of the garden's staff and students, as well as outsideMounting guidelines for herbarium sample 1ace the acid-free herbarium sheet on a piece of cardboard. mount the her-barium label in the bottom right corner of the herbarium sheet. make sure that the label does not hang over the edges of the herbarium sheet (leave an 1/8" - 1/16" edge).An herbarium or of an isolated herbarium specimen is deter-mined by, and dependent upon, the completeness of the actual specimen (s) and the notes which accompany it (them) . making an herbarium is the only economical way in which examples of many different kinds of plants, growing naturally in many different places, differing in
