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Methodology of targum onkelos. onkelos' aramaic translation of the pentateuch (five books of moses) is almost entirely a word-by-word, literal translation of the hebrew masoretic text, with very little supplemental material in the form of aggadic paraphrase. however, where there are found difficult biblical passages, onkelos seeks to minimize ambiguities and obscurities.
